1. “Prospero’s portrayal — ruthless yet apologetic — is what makes the drama appealing.”

Write an essay in which you describe ONE instance in which Prospero is presented positively AND ONE instance in which he is presented negatively. You must also discuss how his actions affect another character in ONE of the instances described. Finally, you must examine ONE technique Shakespeare uses to heighten conflict in the play.

TI-JEAN AND HIS BROTHERS — Derek Walcott

2. “The mother plays a significant role in *Ti-Jean and His Brothers*.”

Write an essay in which you describe TWO occasions when the mother is featured. You must also discuss how her actions impact ONE character in ONE of the instances described. Finally, you must examine ONE technique the writer uses to demonstrate the importance of the mother in the play.

Finally, for EACH poem, you must examine ONE device EACH poet uses to portray the impact of societal norms on individuals.

4. “Good and bad experiences influence our decisions.”

From the prescribed list, choose TWO poems you have studied and for EACH poem, describe the decision the speaker must make based on his or her experiences. You must also discuss how ONE speaker is affected by the decision he or she has made. Finally, for EACH poem, you must examine ONE device EACH poet uses to explore how a good OR a bad experience influences decisions.

BREATH, EYES, MEMORY — Edwidge Danticat

6. “In *Breath, Eyes, Memory*, the *Tonton Macoutes* are brutal male figures who are particularly violent towards the female characters. However, the presence of the *Tonton Macoutes* is positively counterbalanced by Joseph and Marc, the two major male characters in the novel.”

Write an essay in which you describe the *Tonton Macoutes* and EITHER Joseph OR Marc. You must also discuss the impact of EITHER Joseph OR Marc on a named female character. Finally, you must examine ONE technique the writer uses to highlight differences between major male characters and the *Tonton Macoutes*.

A WORLD OF PROSE FOR CSEC — David Williams and Hazel Simmons-McDonald

7. “‘Mom Luby and the Social Worker’ and ‘The Man of the House’ are short stories that focus on poverty.”

Write an essay in which you focus on the portrayal of poverty in these TWO stories.

For EACH story, describe the impact of poverty on EACH protagonist. You must also discuss the factors which contribute to poverty for ONE of the protagonists. Finally, for EACH story, you must examine ONE technique the writer uses to present poverty.

8. From the prescribed list, choose TWO stories you have studied that make EITHER positive OR negative comments about society.

For EACH story, describe ONE event that explores EITHER a positive OR a negative aspect of that society. You must also discuss EITHER the positive OR negative effect of ONE of the events described. Finally, for EACH story, you must examine ONE technique the writer uses to make positive OR negative comments about society.
